

**ACADEMIC ARTICULATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN  
KING UNIVERSITY AND CLEVELAND STATE COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

King University and Cleveland State Community College recognize the need and importance of facilitating the transfer of students from one institution to the other as they pursue their academic goals. Therefore, King University and Cleveland State Community College enter into this agreement for the purpose of articulating policies and procedures governing the matriculation of Cleveland State Community College graduates at King University.

1. Holders of Associate Degrees

- 1.1. Students who have previously earned a degree at Cleveland State Community College will generally be considered as having met all of the King University Core Curriculum provided that they have 30 credit hours of general education courses that include at least one course in each of the following:

- 1.1.1.1.1. Composition
- 1.1.1.1.2. Literature or Art or Fine Arts or Music or Theatre
- 1.1.1.1.3. History or Political Science or Economics
- 1.1.1.1.4. Religion or Psychology or Sociology or Anthropology or Foreign Language
- 1.1.1.1.5. College Mathematics
- 1.1.1.1.6. Science (with lab)

- to reach remainder of the 30 hours: Any course(s) in Arts & Sciences

2. Transfer Credits

- 2.1. Transfer students from Cleveland State Community College who have taken a baccalaureate-oriented course of study but have not completed an associate degree will receive credit on a course-by-course basis. Any course with a grade of C or better will be evaluated by King University for credit.

3. Licensure Programs

- 3.1. King University and Cleveland State Community College agree to work to develop specific articulation agreements between them in regard to programs that require licensure (i.e., nursing and education).

4. Financial Aid

- 4.1. Students admitted to King University from Cleveland State Community College may be eligible for merit scholarships based upon academic performance, as well as other forms of financial aid.
- 4.2. All Cleveland State Community College graduates who transfer as full-time students to King University are eligible for financial aid on the same basis as any King University student.

5. Residency Requirement

- 5.1. Students must meet the residency requirement of 48 King University credits and complete all requirements of their selected major/minor.


6. Institutional Cooperation

- 6.1. During the period of this agreement, both institutions agree to monitor academic performance of students enrolling under this agreement and notify each other concerning any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the status of this agreement.
- 6.2. During the period of this agreement, King University agrees to provide to Cleveland State the names of students who have been accepted to King University and to notify Cleveland State when those students graduate from King University.

7. Dissolution of Agreement


7.1. The above provisions are agreed to and shall go into effect when signed by the appropriate institutional representatives. They shall remain in force until superseded by official action of either institution.

7.2. Should either or both institutions decide to withdraw from this agreement, it is agreed that any and all students enrolled in this program will be given the opportunity to complete the program of study described in this articulation agreement.
